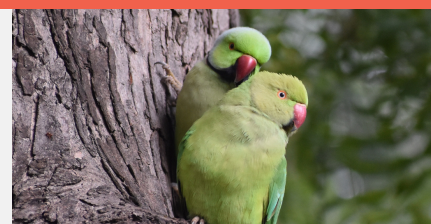
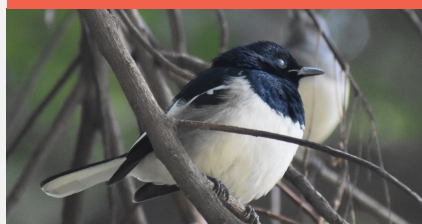

Much loved teacher, a guide and colleague, she leaves behind numerous memories in the hearts of the students she taught.

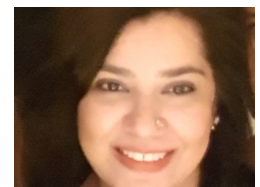


Editors Desk
