Unifying Efforts: Enhancing Classroom Air Quality at Raghubir Singh Junior Modern School

A joint effort of the RSJMS Management and PTA/parent community to install portable air purifiers in classrooms, has helped address the health challenges faced by children due to high levels of pollution. This initiative, supported by over 50% of the parents, should help improve the indoor air quality.

The overwhelming response from parents, with many contributing amounts exceeding the minimum requirement, led to the target amount for the purchase of 40 air purifiers being met within 72 hours. RSJMS Managing Committee approved the installation of the air purifiers as a pilot project. The results have been very encouraging. The initiative exemplifies the collective effort of various stakeholders to create a healthy, clean environment for the children and should act as a template for such collaboration in the future.



From a Modernite's Desk

As Modern School recently celebrated its centenary year, my mother, Anusuya, who lives in Mumbai is about to celebrate her 100th birthday on 30th March, 2024. Anusuya Shankarlal was one of the few girls who began her education at the very start of Modern school. She recalls now, as much as her memory permits...



A few anecdotes –It was the early 1930's and Anusuya who was a favourite of Mrs. Raghubir Singh, would be picked up from school and taken to Mrs.Raghubir Singh's haveli for a treat from Mitthan Halwai's shop in the old city. Her classmates were Kanwal Kishan, PC Lal and Shanti Sethi, and they remained lifelong friends.Kanwal Kishen later became an income tax commissioner and PC Lal Air Chief Marshal of India but all of them had an easy camaraderie and remained in touch with each other for a long time.

At age 99, Anusuya recounts a memory of their school principal Mrs.Bose, digging her nails into the arms of her students when she wanted to punish them! But the students got even, as with a touch of her trademark humour Anusuya talks of an incident where the students poked a beehive around Mrs. Bose's office, and ran into a classroom and locked themselves in, while she contended with the bees!Anusuya's father, Sir Shankarlal was an eminent businessman in the city of Delhi and eventually a patron of the school. The Shankarlal Hall is named after him.



And then several years later, Anusuya's sister Savitri, married Lala Raghubir Singh's son, Pratap Singh.

I wanted to share my Mother's memories as a fitting tribute to the Modern Schools farsighted vision of creating a gender equal space for education, development and fun for all children, as far back as 1920, when girls in India were destined to stay within the confines of "purdah" and all that it entailed.
