

MSOSA - Towards a Higher Purpose

Dear Modernites,

At the outset, I would like to wish you and your families a happy and healthy 2022. The year that has gone by was difficult in many respects. However, it gave us an opportunity to reflect on the journey that MSOSA has undertaken over many decades and the role it must perform to support our community in the years ahead.

MSOSA - the Intent

The Modern School Old Students Association (MSOSA) was set up in 1957 with the intent to promote bonding within the old students' community and with the students of our alma-mater. I must share that under the aegis of MSOSA, the first play 'Kanjoos' staged in 1960 witnessed participation from school students apart from Modernites. Emanating this spirit, the first 25 years were devoted to cultural activities to promote the social interaction within these communities.

Extension to Philanthropy – The Modernites Trust

In 1983, as our community grew bigger, a group of senior Modernites established 'The Modernites Trust' as a philanthropic arm to reach out to the underprivileged sections of society. The purpose was to get involved in charitable activities, especially education for the students (refer to the column by the Modernites Trust Chairman - Justice Sanjay Kishan Kaul). This was a defining moment. Since then, most philanthropic activities are undertaken in partnership with the Trust.

Expansion Phase

Over time, MSOSA committed itself to both — cultural and social initiatives. To promote its objectives, MSOSA expanded its range of activities to sports, inter school debates, etc. While there was continuity provided by the Annual Play, the bonding within Modernites was strengthened through Senior Modernites Dinner and Golden Jubilee

and Silver Jubilee Reunions, which brought Modernites of different generations back to the school. The Annual Ball catered to the needs of younger generation of Modernites. At the same time, the Trust expanded its domain to reach out to the retired Modern School teachers through its programs to address their needs.

The Covid Challenge

The pandemic resulted in an unprecedented challenge to MSOSA since its inception. It disrupted the annual calendar of activities due to various restrictions imposed by the regulatory bodies. The Association moved quickly to adapt to the changed scenario, largely operating in a hybrid format. Several physical activities had to be postponed or cancelled. Yet, the online format helped us innovate and create new opportunities. We leveraged the format to expand the reach and connect with Modernites around the world. During this period, our online events including the Zoom Dhamaka and the Theatre Festival Programs were huge successes. As the situation improved, a few physical events were also organized. This required a lot of last-minute decisions and restructuring.

Empathy at the Core

Reorganizing the activities was the easy part. The pandemic affected all the school communities represented by Modernites, teachers (serving and retired) and school students. It posed various challenges - medical, social, psychological, and financial. The school community lost over 80 Modernites and many teachers and students lost their loved ones. Amidst this distressful time, MSOSA organized an online Prayer Meeting to pray for the departed souls and bring closure to the distraught families. It was important to empathize with all who were affected. MSOSA volunteers called up the retired teachers to check on their wellbeing. Funds were raised from the Modernites community in partnership with the Modernites Trust to provide relief to the teachers and the students, to support them in this difficult time. This is an ongoing activity.

Towards A Higher Purpose

MSOSA collected over INR 25 lakhs for the 'Gurupranam' program. The recently launched 'Dare to Dream' initiative for Modernites who need financial support to pursue higher education, has also received positive response. Associations like ours need to be driven by a higher purpose and should step up to support our community in difficult times. I am grateful to the Modernites family for their unstinted support.

The Modernites Trust: Giving Back to our Community

The Modernites Trust owes its existence to the vision of eminent and senior Modernites, who were part of MSOSA, to support philanthropic and charitable activities. MSOSA, along with other donors, created a corpus to fund the commendable initiative of educating children in Modern School, who came from economically weaker sections of society. This was during the time when there were no Government schemes, as present today.

Over a period of time, the list of activities was expanded to include contributions for national causes such as the Kargil War Relief in 1999, the Gujarat Earthquake Relief in 2001 and the Tsunami Relief in 2004.

The footprints of the Modernites Trust's activities have gone beyond educating a certain number of students at the school, who are meritorious, but need economic support. The Scholarship initiative has at present, 35 students from S-1 to S-7, who are given financial assistance not only towards fees and uniforms throughout their school education, but also additional support in the form of tuitions and laptops. The COVID times posed a challenge and technology upgradation to assist the students became a necessity.

One area of expansion has been the 'Dare to Dream' initiative whereby meritorious Modernite scholars are given an opportunity to dream beyond school education for pursuing studies through colleges and universities, including in the fields of engineering, medicine, aviation and so on. This noble initiative has helped young and talented students realize their potential and achieve great success. The most satisfying feature is that some of these very scholars who have excelled, have come back to support the Trust.

The Modern School has always taken pride in the commitment of its teaching faculty. The 'Gurudakshina' programme is a step towards recognizing the contributions of our retired teachers. These esteemed teachers are honored, and a purse is given in recognition of their contributions. We have had over 55 beneficiaries under this programme. Holding the hands of these teachers who held our hands in the years gone by does not end with this purse, as volunteers from MSOSA stay in touch with them to offer any other assistance that they may need. Modernites who are Doctors, Chartered Accountants, Lawyers, etc. have volunteered to give assistance pro bono to these teachers. COVID times have required an online process of 'Gurupranam' initiative, with an enhanced assistance of medical support.

We have been through a difficult two years and there does not seem to be an end, at least as yet. Families have lost their near and dear ones, including some students and in such times, support to them has become a matter of necessity. We have come across progenies of retired teachers who passed away during these difficult times, who are also in need of support. These are initiatives necessary to meet causes, which are arising in these times.

The aforesaid has required an expansion of activities of the Trust and varied approaches to sub-serving the objective with which it was originally set up — scholarship funds, promotion of education, literature, art, promoting research in Indology and Indian cultural studies and dissemination of knowledge in various fields, among others. The funds donated are required to be kept in safe investment, which is a limitation on the returns that are possible. These returns have decreased over time as expenses have increased. A modified approach to the Trust's activities has been that scholars are adopted by donors, which may collectively be a batch of Modernites or individuals who would continue to fund the students, instead of donating a corpus on account of the limitation of income that the corpus can generate.

We have confidence that the Modernites fraternity spread all over the world would keep on assisting in furthering the avowed objective of this Trust to provide education to the needy and for them to dream further, apart from taking care of our Gurus who contributed in making us what we are.

Natak Mandli Theatre Festival

With the pandemic leading to worldwide lockdowns, MSOSA attempted to digitise theatre and the legacy of theatre like never before. For the first time, the play was made accessible to all Modernites across the globe - leading to a large number of Modernites seeing the play for the first time. The much anticipated theatre week witnessed Modernite families come together and watch the rib-tickling productions together! The festival included 4 one-act plays adapted and directed by Ms. Sohaila Kapur (Class of 1971), featuring 16 Modernite actors and countless crew members. Further, MSOSA collaborated with NewsX for a documentary titled- 'MSOSA Natak Mandli: Celebrating Our Legacy (1960-2021)'. The documentary was a first time effort to chronicle the evolution and history of Natak Mandali with first hand accounts from all those who have associated with it over several past decades.

The theatre festival was dedicated to Mr. Ashok Dhawan (Class of 1958), a veteran actor, architect and an integral part of the MSOSA Natak Mandli, who passed away just a few days before the play due to COVID. He had been part of the MSOSA plays right from 1960 to 2021. Mr. Dhawan was key in conceptualising the Theatre Festival and the documentary made in collaboration with NewsX.



The hybrid version of the event received great response as it was live telecasted across YouTube and Facebook, connecting Modernites across the globe.

During the event, MSOSA & the Modernites Trust honoured retired teachers, who had selflessly served the institution and shaped lives of many students, by conferring them with the Gurudakshina Award. Further, this year the selection committee headed by Hon'ble Justice Sanjay Kishan Kaul, added two illustrious Modernites-Dr. Syeda Saiyidain Hameed & Mr. Gopalkrishna Gandhi- to the Wall of Fame. The conclave this year- 'World in Turmoil Crisis in Leadership'- witnessed the sharing of ideas by an illustrious panel including, Prof. Harshpal Singh Sachdev, Prof. Rajeev Bhargava, Ms. Sunita Narain & Mr. Rishabh Gulati and moderated by Hon'ble Justice Sanjay Kishan Kaul. The discussion focused on how the pandemic has been a learning curve for organisations and for the Government, highlighting the importance of flexibility and empathy in leadership. The conclave also shed light on the impact of the pandemic on global economy, trade and the economics of the 'new normal'.

The Golden Jubilee Lunch was a heartwarming tribute to the 1970 & 1971 batches- wherein over 100 Modernites relived the golden days of school!










Leadership Lecture Series with Mr. Shiv Khera-Turning Setbacks into Comebacks
